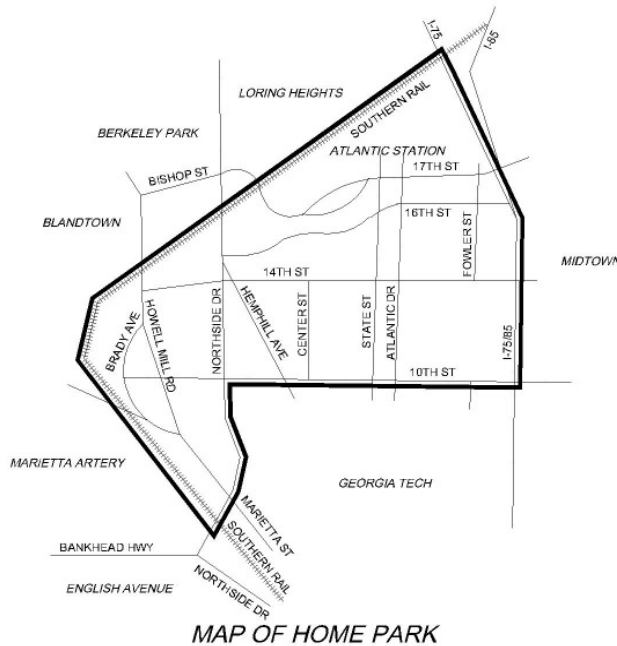


Nominations for 2006!
